The Makerspace will still be open their normal hours during this time but will not take bookings – they will only be accepting walk in appointments.



Holiday Hours

Te Āhuru Mōwai will be closed on 25, 26 December and 1, 2 January 2025.

Open Plus access during non-staffed hours is available.

MCHL members can add Open Plus privileges to their membership by signing up at the front counter. Members can unlock the Stafford Street entrance by scanning their membership card and entering their pin free of charge.

Inside, they can use resources and self-service equipment like self-checkout machines, computers, and printers.

Meeting rooms require separate advance booking. Members can bring guests with them, and it can be a quiet escape from holiday chaos.

Did you know that we host Makerspace workshop evenings?

The MCHL Makerspace at Te Āhuru Mōwai is a creative hub offering handson workshops since November. With more workshops planned for the new year.

Participants have explored various techniques, including:

- · Laser Cutting: Creating personalised keepsake boxes.
- Sublimation Printing: Transferring designs onto T-shirts and mugs using heat and pressure.
- Glass Etching: Engraving wine glasses and tumblers with laser technology.
- Vinyl Transfer: Making Christmas decorations by cutting vinyl designs.

Workshops cater to all skill levels, providing access to high-quality equipment and knowledgeable staff. Most equipment requires reservation for guaranteed availability and preparation.

Create space in your summer break for Readopoly

Manawatū Community Hub Libraries launched it's summer reading programme, December 9. Now in its second year, Readopoly is available free of charge and helps to instil reading as a lifelong habit while also enhancing children's abilities as readers, writers, and spellers. Additionally, it provides an opportunity for family bonding.

During the summer holidays, many children experience a decline in the knowledge and skills they acquired throughout the school year - a phenomenon known as Summer Learning Loss. To help combat the decline and provide support for children and their families during the summer months Readopoly is a fun and interactive way to encourage reading.


It has been found that young readers are more motivated to read when they can select books that align with their interests. Readopoly allows for the option of children choosing their reading materials however, if participants require assistance, a recommended reading list with helpful suggestions is available.

The boards have been beautifully illustrated by Barry McGoldrick, Graphic Designer from Manawatū District Council. With the addition of an astronaut themed twist, Barry aims to inspire children to embrace the challenge and tap into their imaginations.

Kids will embark on an adventurous journey filled with reading books and completing fun, book-related tasks. Each board comes with dice and 3D printed astronaut created in the Makerspace, which participants use to play. Every child who returns their board will receive a prize and be entered into a draw for exciting book prizes. Participants will have a total of six weeks to complete the programme.

Play Trailer



You will need your MCHL membership number and PIN/password to access ePukapuka or Libby.




Gingerbread House Decorating Class

Stories of impact: fostering a love for reading, one wag at a time

Paws for Reading offers a relaxed environment where children can engage in one-on-one, 15-minute reading sessions with a friendly, non-judgmental border collie from Canine Pet Friends Therapy Dogs.

Reading aloud plays a vital role in developing a child's reading skills. However, many kids become self-conscious as they sound out words or stumble across text. The approach of reading to a dog diminishes the fear of judgment and gradually enhances the child's self-confidence. In a cozy space at Manawatū Community Hub Libraries (MCHL), complete with a large comfortable bean bag, the child reads to the dog, fostering a safe and calming atmosphere. This setup empowers children to read at their level, free from any pressure or criticism.

Lynda Cummins from Canine Pet Friends Therapy Dogs has two border collies that lead a cheerful life on a nearby rural property. She brings one dog at a time to participate in this special service. Lynda expresses the expected joy, stating, "The moment Byrne has the scarf on, he understands it's time for a visit, and he knows he'll be showered with affection." Byrne, her 8-year-old collie, relishes the experience, while his 3-and-a-half-year-old nephew, Jet, has a more playful personality. Jet is gradually acclimatising to the world of being read to, taking it one affectionate pat at a time. Both are well-mannered dogs who respond easily to commands and adore having their tummies rubbed. "These experiences not only help build children's confidence around dogs but also encourage positive interactions. For kids, the chance to read aloud and make mistakes in the company of a friendly dog contributes to their personal growth." Lynda sees this first hand as she is in the room to offer guidance when needed, but mostly, she assumes a supervisory role.

The programme began in November this year, and MCHL staff are optimistic about its growth in popularity and longevity with further plans to incorporate more dog-related experiences during children's story times and at Brightsparks.
